

SARI CREATED WITH MOST NUMBER OF HOOKS AND DESIGN CARDS

P. R. Subramaniam Chetty & Corporation, of Tindivanam, Tamil Nadu, manufactured a handloom silk sari named 'Puspahara' (garland of flowers), using a total of 1,46,600 punched design cards, and 1,920 hooks, and completed it on April 14, 2011. This silk woven sari was made within a duration of one month and illustrates 32 natural shades. It measures 5.92 m in length, 124.5 cm in width, weighs 1,440 gm and costs Rs. 1,50,000.
